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
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WANT TO BE AN AUTHENTIC WITNESS?

PRACTICE LIVING THE METHOD IN COMMUNITY!

I was moved by the witness of a new sister at the closing of the 215th Cursillo. What got me? She told the community that long before she showed up for the weekend, the entire parish community embraced her and started to walk with her, warts and all. She was moved by the witness of her parish community and was delighted to see the larger community at the closing but not really surprised; she had seen it all before.

This weekend witness caused me to think about my drinking habits, not what they are, but what they should be. You have not seen this in the literature until you read this; the Cursillo Movement is an invitation to drink as long as your drinking partner is the "Samaritan Woman."



John 4: 39-40 says this of the Samaritan woman: "Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in him because of the word of the woman who testified, "He told me everything I have done." When the Samaritans came to him, they invited him to stay with them; and he stayed for two days...." Who has come to your group reunion, Ultreya or Parish with such a witness? If no one is coming, you have not spent enough time at the Samaritan Woman's watering hole; you know she drank the living water which is the risen and living Christ. This Lent, instead of giving up something, take time to figure out how you can drink more of the living water and become a fountain for a brother or sister

The essence of our Movement is to be a fountain of living water for the brother or sister who is searching (everybody is searching, just in case you did not know).

So, who is searching for a drink from your group? I showed up for a closing and heard several new sisters witnessing, and it sounded something like this: "The coordinator had her group reunion as part of the weekend community; I really wanted to be part of that community, and I felt like they invited me to be one with them!" How authentic is your invitation? I showed up at team formation recently and there were several team members from Laurel; everyone from Laurel said that Marty Novak had a profound influence on them living their communal life in the Movement. It was as if everyone in the Laurel Ultreya was sponsored by or in reunion with Marty Novak. I wasn't from that Ultreya, but I had been in a group reunion with Marty for about 10 years. When those who search see your group and the authenticity of your invitation, they will come. Don't believe me; ask the woman who witnessed about the parish community embracing her, or the sisters who saw themselves in the coordinator's group. Take the real challenge; find a Cursillista in the Laurel Ultreya who was not connected to Marty Novak.



This note is designed to help you with your walk and begins by introducing witnesses. It is an invitation to join the crowd that goes to the same well where the Samaritan woman drank. The folk who drank the living water are described like this: "They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers" (Acts 2: 42). And who should be initiated into drinking with the Samaritan Woman?

Pope Francis says, "The Church will have to initiate everyone – priests, religious and laity – into this "art of accompaniment," which teaches us to remove our sandals before the sacred ground of the other (cf. Exodus 3: 5)" (EG #169).

What did "they" do to initiate? "They defeated him by the blood of the Lamb and by the power of their testimony... "(Revelation 12: 11). We have evidence - a parish, a group reunion and an individual that drank with the Samaritan Woman. How do we share the good news so that hungry and thirsty folk see our group (Reunion, Ultreya or Parish) as a source for an abundance of living water to go with the bread of life? This Lent go back to the source of living water as the Samaritan Woman did and invest real time in devotion to the communal life. Then find someone with whom you can share; then initiate them with your witness! Ultreya!

A Cursillista Beyond Washington Cursillo

Reflecting on Phyllis' appointment to the talk "Cursillista Beyond the Cursillo," I realized that I have a witness about my experience of leaving Washington for Florida, leaving Cursillo behind for . . . Lord knows what. Well, the Lord did indeed know.

In January 2012, we traveled to Florida to take possession of our new little house, and spent a week getting everything set up—you know, TV cable, water hookup, phone line, etc. Then we hurried back to Washington because Pat's vacation from work was up, she had not yet retired.

A month or so later, I returned to Florida to take up residence, leaving Pat to wind up her job. On my to-do list was to look into finding Cursillo in the Venice Diocese so as to continue my commitment to the Method.

Walking into my new home, I immediately noticed there were messages on the shiny new phone, and dialed up to retrieve them. The first message went something like this: "Hi, Mary! I'm Terry, coordinator for the Walk to Emmaus starting on Thursday. I want to welcome you to the Walk. Call me at 111-1111 if you have any questions."

Now, for those unaware of Walk to Emmaus, it's one of the descendants of Cursillo, organized for protestant denominations, with the same methodology and goals, but changed to fit protestant sensibilities.

Here's a shocker! I'm looking for Cursillo, and here's something a bit like Cursillo! So I left that message undeleted and went on to the next message, which was also about Emmaus: "Hi, Mary! This is Terry, from Emmaus. I enjoyed getting to know you over the weekend. We have Group Reunion coming up on Saturday, and we'd like you to join us. Call me on 111-1111 for details."

I didn't delete that message either, but prayed about it for a few days, meditating on the opportunities God puts in our way.

Meanwhile, I worked through my to-dos as I had planned. In a week or so, feeling that my phone messages, even though intended for the previous owner of my phone line, must also have been meant for me, I dialed 111-1111 and told Terry the story and asked her if I could join her group, too, even though she had not invited me. Terry told me that her group was women only, but that Bob Smith had a men's group near me that would happily welcome me.

Bob Smith? That seemed a familiar name. Who was he? Then I realized that earlier that morning I had bought a bike from a Bob Smith who lived just a few blocks away, compared the phone numbers, and found I already knew Bob. Is the Holy Spirit knocking, or what?

Long story, but now I'm the Catholic in a Methodist group reunion and giving witness in an entirely new and challenging way.

BTW, I soon thereafter found a Catholic Ultreya and through them formed a Catholic group I also attend. The Protestant Ultreyas have not worked well for me.
