Also, Pre Cursillo and 4th Day have worked hard to reenergize the aspects of our Movement in relation to encouraging folks to sponsor others and hold events that will keep us together as a community.

In relation to our needs in the area of sponsorship and in the bigger picture of the Movement and its discernment generally, we need every Cursillista to be praying, going to adoration and asking for an infusion of the Holy Spirit, and possibly fasting for our Movement. If we do not pray for us who will?

We all want to have the weekends reinstated. And even now we are actively looking for people in our environments who might make good leaders and be good candidates for a weekend. If you find someone, even though we do not have a weekend to send them on right now, you should be inviting them to come to small group and to Ultreya. You should be building in them a habit of living the method, so that when we do finally restore holding weekends, they will be ready for the message and welcome it. While they can't make a weekend immediately, they can become a Cursillista at heart because they are a part of our small group community.

Our community, if it is truly living the method as it should be and is still inviting folks into the life of Christ, should have, when we finally do restore weekends, so many candidates that we will need to hold several weekends to catch up!

Each one of us walking in our 4th day journey should be actively sharing the excitement and joy that Cursillo is. Each of us should be inviting folks we think are potentially good leaders in the communities and environments we find ourselves in to join our small groups, so that they can begin preparation for making a weekend. Each of us should also be praying every day for our Movement's discernment and its reenlivening in the Power of the Holy Spirit.



So, what are we doing in the Secretariat that would show you that Cursillo is Alive and Well here in Washington D.C? On the surface, if you are not a member of the secretariat or a member of one of its committees, you probably don't think much is going on. But you would be wrong!

Back in January, we began a revamped Leaders School, founded on the original Cursillo Charism's idea that there are three essential elements to what a Leader's Group Reunion is: The Doctrinal Talk, the Technique Talk, and The Visit to the Blessed Sacrament. These essential elements are taken from the National Cursillo publication, *"How to Program a School of Leaders."*

Future meetings of the Leaders School will include these three essential elements. We all know what a visit to the Blessed Sacrament is like, but from the perspective of our Cursillo Movement it is hoped that it will turn on the "God's fire hose of Grace" to rejuvenate our Movement in ways that will enliven every aspect of our individual walks with Christ, but also our small group communities and our Ultreyas. Cursillo recognizes the need for progressive conversion and how it happens most often in the context of common prayer.

While being before the Holy Eucharist in adoration is not "common" by any means, it is in making our exposure to the radiation of Grace that emanates forth from the Holy Eucharist that hearts are changed and become more in union with Christ. The Doctrinal Talk is designed to foster and contribute to the progressive conversion of the leaders attending Leaders School by providing regular opportunities where leaders can hear an explanation of the means of deepening their union with God, the things that will help them put on the mind of Christ and the Church, Christ's Bride, using Holy Scripture, documents from Vatican II, papal encyclicals, and Eduardo Bonnin's writings. The Doctrinal Talk is intended to be study's strong leg in the tripod. The Doctrinal Talk is given by a spiritual director.

The Technique Talk is designed to address different aspects of the techniques employed by Cursillo in relation to the principal areas of the Movement, including Pre-Cursillo, 3-Day, and 4th Day, and provides explanations of the "**why**," "**wherefore**," and "**how**" of each element or principal areas of the Cursillo. Technique Talks are usually given by members of the lay Cursillo community.

Please consider coming soon to one of the meetings of our revamped Leaders School. You will not regret it and we can assure you that you will have a good experience that will energize you in your walk with Christ.

In Pre-Cursillo, we are currently looking for new chairs to lead this committee, and we are doing the same for 4th Day. While we are doing this, we are also beginning a process of realigning the 3-Day Committee, first in preparation for the reinstitution of regularly holding weekends, but also in the areas of revamping the Coordinators Workshops, reviewing the essential and non-essential elements of the weekend tasks, and reviewing how the committee can better support coordinators. Once Leaders School is operating smoothly, which we expect soon with the appointment of the newly-chosen Chair, we will move next to the 3-Day Committee in preparation for holding weekends.

Our discernment is bearing fruit, which will soon become more visible as we progress into the work of the other committees of the secretariat.

Cursillo is indeed ALIVE AND WELL!

When we made our weekends, if you took things to heart that you heard on your weekend, you knew piety, study, and action were important. If you are an active member of a small group, every couple of weeks you have to think about your closest moment to Christ, what you are reading or have learned about your faith, and you have to review what you have done to live your faith. This is what piety, study, and action are all about. But how do you get traction in improving your living of piety, study and action?

If you are like most Cursillistas, you might answer, my traction comes from the accountability I get in small group from my spiritual friends. And this would be true. But then there is the question of what I can do on a daily basis to give myself an idea of how to improve how I am living my piety, study, and action. The answer is the Examen. Below you will find a copy of the Examen that is revised to address piety, study, and action, and which you may find helpful in giving you a way of holding yourself accountable for living the Cursillo Method on a daily basis.

The Examen

Praying the Jesuit Examen of Consciousness Looking at Cursillo's Piety, Study and Action

THANKSGIVING

Lord, I realize that all, even myself, Is a gift from You. Today, for what things am I most grateful?

INTENTION

Lord, open my eyes and ears to see You with me in this day. Today, what do I really want for myself in my temporal life and spiritually? Show me how You have revealed Yourself to me? Open my heart to really see the graces of my close moments where You were present to me. Show me the moments when You were most present where I did not notice you?

EXAMINATION

Lord, show me where You have been with me in the events and persons I have experienced today. Today, in what ways have I experienced Your love? What did you wish me to learn from my readings today, in my life lessons from my daily activities and encounters with others, and in the silent ways You have communicated with me today? What actions did you call me to do today?

FORGIVENESS

Lord, forgive me for failing to see You and to respond to You today. Today, what choices have been inadequate responses to Your love? Where did I fail to act when You wanted me to act?

HOPE

Lord, give me confidence and a generous heart as I move into tomorrow. Today, how will I let You lead me to a brighter tomorrow? Lead me to what You desire me to do as I live the fruits of my piety, which is holiness; as I live the fruits of my study, which is formation; and as I live the fruits of my action, which is evangelization!

To Be or Not to Be – Is Cursillo a Ministry or Not?

After one of the first weekends I worked, I ran into one of our "Babe Chicks" who had made the weekend. I hadn't seen this Cursillista in quite some time, and so I asked them why that was. The response was, well, I have been quite busy and am involved with a lot of the ministries at my church. I just don't have time for another ministry. This statement somewhat took me by surprise because I hadn't thought of Cursillo as a ministry, but rather as a way of life, while this Cursillista saw Cursillo, as just another of a group of competing admittedly holy ways of volunteering, and therefore something they did not have time for. This Cursillista is both right and wrong.

Our hope, when the "Babe Chicks" walk away from the weekend they just made, is that they will first of all embrace the idea incorporating Cursillo's method of piety, study, and action into their daily lives so that they will live the Christian ideal we try to point them to in the Ideal Talk in a real way on a daily basis. Something that we have spent much time in our Washington Movement trying to convince "Babe Chicks" about is that Cursillo is not just another ministry, but a way of living the Christian Ideal!



One of the things that we are now facing in our movement is a lack of volunteerism, which is not surprising, given how much we in our movement have not really encouraged folks to step forward and be active in helping to run events or lead and organize activities. Committee Co-chairs on the Secretariat are finding it very difficult to find people willing to step up and be either active members of Secretariat committees, or Committee Cochairs, and Ultreya Leaders are finding it very difficult to get folks to step up and be Ultreya leaders. We need to have this change and change soon, particularly if Cursillo means anything to all those folks who have made a weekend and are supposedly living their 4th day.



Stepping up and volunteering to serve on or lead one of the Secretariat committees or stepping up and serve as an Ultreya Leader requires a good measure of personal sacrifice, and such service is a form of ministry that competes with the other ministries a Cursillista may be involved with, but if we do not get willing people to step forward and start helping with the ministerial aspects of our Cursillo Movement, our efforts to move our Movement forward will be more and more hampered and held back. While Cursillo is not essentially a ministry, like serving as a Eucharistic Minister, a person who visits the sick, or working an RCIA team, still, we need people to step forward to help make things happen like holding weekends, managing supplies, leading Ultreyas, working weekends, sponsoring candidates and then following through with their formation in the year after their sponsored babe chick made their weekend.

Please consider dedicating some time to serving on one of our Secretariat Committees, stepping up to lead one of these committees, serving as an Ultreya leader, helping to run some of our 4th day activities, and so on. If not you, who? If not now, when?
