BE STILL AND KNOW THAT I AM GOD

EVERY ONE IS INVITED TO JOIN THE

"PSALM 46: 10 COMMITTEE"

It's been a long break since I last served on the Secretariat. If you have been in the military, another government agency, the chancery or the central office, you learn the real why nobody wants to be at headquarters. Headquarters is the check valve, the screen in the garbage disposal, the place where the buck stops. The Secretariat is like headquarters except for one thing, it is an environment group reunion (if does not mean anything to you, it's time that you revisit the School of Leaders). I don't do committee reports. I come to the Secretariat meeting and ask the same question at every meeting: "How does your individual action as a Cursillista, and your collective action as a special group reunion help to build God's community?"

I am on the Psalm 46: 10 Committee. Every time I show up for a meeting, I am charged to ask the communal gathering to "Be still and know that I am God." Of course I am not God: I am the bald-headed baby deacon at the corner of the table without a committee report to give. The real joy of our Cursillo Movement is that the Secretariat, the special environmental group reunion, does the exercise to be still and be aware of the awesome presence of the Christ who lives and transforms lives. Once aware of God's presence, and only then, is this group prepared to clean the screen where garbage collects so God's grace comes more abundantly to those living and learning the Cursillo Method.




The Secretariat is always focused on creating and sustaining group reunions here because that is the Cursillo Method to assure that there are more saints in heaven. At times, it appears that the **Psalm 46: 10 Committee** is the smallest in the Movement.

The Palanca Committee is working on prayers from the world community; the angels are scrambling to fix the schedule after checking in with all the other committees.

The Liturgy Committee is trying to get the essentials into the schedule along with an AGAPE and MANANITA. Nuts & Bolts is handling nuts and bolts of the weekend. The Core Team is refining the schedule and cleaning the screen in the garbage disposal to assure that the grace flows thru the three Day Weekend.

I could concoct a similar story about the Secretariat, but that is not the point of this story; the point is "Be still and know that I am God."



Everything fits into the schedule except the consistent work of the **Psalm 46: 10 Committee.** There is not enough time, nor is there a high priority given to the work of this committee.

This committee is charged with the often over-looked essential, **QUIET TIME**. What does the quiet time do?

- Sets the tone for the weekend after introductions and the first two meditations
- Gives the babe chick an extra moment reflect on the talk in order to share how the living God impacted the life of one who is suddenly conscious of Christ's presence in his or her life
- Makes the meditation real for the team and the babe chicks
- Enables babe chicks and the team to experience the depth of God's love thru palanca and sacrifice given for those on the weekend out of God's boundless love
- Gives time for the examination of conscience that makes the sacrament of Reconciliation the best confession ever on the weekend
- Gets the babe chick a chance to ask to extend time with the Christ during Eucharistic adoration
- Provides the moment for the babe chick to ask one of the presenters or witness from a special table group summary to expound on the witness about the living Christ

The Psalm 46: 10 Committee is responsible for these things every time a group assembles and especially on the Cursillo Weekend.

These are the "Magnificent Seven" experiences that are not in the Manuals but are integral parts of our Cursillo Method.

I am inviting you to join the Secretariat in accomplishing the work of the **Psalm 46: 10 Committee.** You need to do only two things – be disciplined about the use of time in presenting the essentials of the Cursillo Weekend and fight to include the quiet time in the schedule because that is when the living Christ is most vividly present to the communal gathering that is the Church.

A Call to all Sponsors and Ultreya Leaders!!!

We are calling on you to let you know that the upcoming weekends are fast approaching. As of this time, we only have one application for the women and the potential of a couple for the men.

Cursillistas, our role is to be the evangelizers for Christ and bring our friends to share in Christ through Cursillo. The way to do this is to talk with your friends who are not Cursillistas and share with them the joy you have by being that ambassador for Christ and sharing Christ within your environments. It is through this sharing that we rely on you to bring candidates into the Cursillo.

What then is being asked of you? In order for our brothers and sister to enjoy in the fruits of Cursillo, you the leaders of our Archdiocese are asked to really begin work NOW to seek and prepare new Cursillistas to ready themselves for the upcoming weekends. The upcoming weekends are as follows:

Women's Cursillo 213th Weekend October 9 - 1, 2014 Men's Cursillo 214th Weekend November 6 - 9, 2014

Please help grow the Cursillo Movement by following the mission of a Cursillo Leader:

"Make a friend, Be a Friend, and Bring your Friend to Christ!"

Sponsorship Guidelines

"Make a friend. Be a friend. Bring your friend to Christ."

For candidates to attend a Cursillo weekend, they MUST have at least one sponsor. To be a sponsor is a privilege as well as a serious Christian responsibility. Sponsoring someone for a Cursillo in Christianity is not a haphazard circumstance. It should be a deliberate act, the result of making Jesus Christ part of our daily life. Therefore, you must know your candidates very well. Before sponsoring, consider the following...

How to be a "good sponsor"?

- A good sponsor is a witness
- You are actively attending Group Reunion, Ultreyas, and Cursillo activities (such as Closings) to grow in Christ with the community
- You are expressing the gospel messages through actions and words within your environments
- You prayerfully select candidates who will lead in the transformation of their environments to Christ
- I. Whom to sponsor the candidate
 - Cursillo is a movement of the Catholic Church, for Catholics only
 - Candidates should be those who will lead in the transformation of their environments to Christ
 - Candidates are willing to make a commitment to the Cursillo Movement's Fourth Day of life, i.e., Group Reunion and Ultreyas to help them persevere in their efforts to live as Christians in the best possible way

II. What the Cursillo is NOT:

- It is NOT just a weekend experience
- It is not for someone who is looking for a retreat
- It is not group therapy for emotional problems **
- It is not a cure-all for personal problems **
 - ** Out of love for and fairness to those having problems, they should be referred to people with the proper training. Who to sponsor should always be a result of discerning prayer.

III. How to Sponsor? What Should

Potential Candidates Be Told?

- Prior to giving your candidate an application:
- Explain the Cursillo method of Piety, Study, and Action
- Stress the beauty and importance of living the Fourth Day
- Take them to Ultreya gatherings before you give them an application
- Invite them to join your Group Reunion
- Explain the 3-day Weekend:
 - Several talks and meditations by lay people and spiritual directors,
 - Discussions and sharing after each talk.
 - Daily Mass
 - Reconciliation
 - Time with the Blessed Sacrament

Important: The Cursillo is not a secret!

IV. How do I support my candidate BEFORE the Weekend?

- Ensure that your candidate is a Catholic
- Accompany your candidate to Group Reunion
- Bring your Candidate to Ultreya
- Offer prayer and sacrifice for your candidate
- If necessary, help the candidate shoulder the cost of the Weekend experience

V. How do I support my candidate

DURING the Weekend?

- Ensure your candidate has had dinner before arrival at the Weekend center
- Transport your candidate to the Cursillo site and introduce your candidate to a weekend team leader or member. At this point, your candidate becomes a Cursillista
- Send Palanca so they know you are supporting them through prayer and sacrifice offered for their Cursillo
- Attend the Cursillo Closing on Sunday evening
- Provide transportation home for your Cursillista

VI. How do I support my candidate AFTER the Weekend?

- Accompany your Cursillista to Group Reunion
- Accompany your Cursillista to Ultreva
- Offer prayer and sacrifice for your Cursillista

- Accompany your Cursillista to the next Diocesan Ultreya, and local Ultreya
- Actively support your Cursillista in the Fourth Day for at least 6 months, through prayer, frequent contact, encouragement to attend Cursillo activities, etc.

Co-Sponsors Are Encouraged

The Fundamental Ideas of the Cursillo Movement, the basic book of the worldwide Cursillo Movement, says:

"It really should be a group or a community that sponsors and supports the candidate, because the living witness of community life adds so much to the effectiveness of the preparation.

- The ideal would be for the candidate to be already a part of a community conducive to his or her union with other Cursillistas in the post-Cursillo."
- If you plan to sponsor a candidate who is not from within your parish or Ultreya community, a co-sponsor from the candidate's local community will help with the necessary Fourth day contacts after the weekend.
- New Cursillistas should be active in Group Reunion and Ultreya for at least 1 year after your Cursillo weekend before taking on this responsibility as an individual. It is highly recommended that you co-sponsor with a Cursillista who has been following the Fourth Day life for a number of years.

Cost of the weekend

A Cursillo costs \$190.00 which includes meals, lodging, and all materials. A fifteen \$15.00 deposit should accompany the application. The remainder is due at the time of the weekend. Payment made by check should be made payable to Washington Cursillo Movement.

Applications

The application is in two parts:

- Your candidate completes (page 1) his or her part of the application,
- You, the Sponsor, a religious and the Ultreya Leader MUST complete page 2 of the Application

"For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead." (Jn. 20:1-9)

When one reflects on the text above, one must recall those moments when the scriptures appeared in a language that was enigmatic to them. I know for myself that there are passages in the Holy Bible that still forces me to wonder like Marvin Gaye, "What's going on?" For instance, the mystery of Jesus' death and resurrection told in the scriptures is hard to understand. It's no wonder the priest always ask the community to recall the mystery of Christ and we respond "Christ has died, Christ has risen, he will come again." Think about what must have been going through Peter's mind when he arrived at the tomb and the body of Jesus was taken. If I was there, I think that because of the "unknowing" I would do like the disciples and lock myself up in the Upper Room as well.

Here are some thoughts for today! When was the last time you read a scripture verse and was puzzled?


Have the Holy Spirit visited you recently causing you to ponder on the mystery of our faith that Christ has died, Christ is risen? Maybe there is a critical question that lives in you that you need answers, where will you go to have a dialogue about your personal journey and discover spiritual direction? Or maybe when you encounter those difficult passages, do you use a black marker to cover the passage that calls you to repent?

Before we go any further, let's reflect on the disciples in the Upper Room; remember here that Jesus sent them to the Upper Room so that they could wait for the Holy Spirit. Jesus said "I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the holy Spirit that the Father will send in my name—he will teach you everything and remind you of all that [I] told you" (Jn. 14:26). Here we notice that if we don't have the Holy Spirit understanding the scriptures will be mission impossible. I think you really want to understand this point here. If one does not allow the Holy Spirit to work in their lives, they will not be able to discern the mystery of the scriptures. The scriptures are not like a good read of "Gone with the Wind" or "Romeo and Juliet." No, the scriptures are the inspired Word of God, "all scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for refutation, for correction, and for training in righteousness" (2 Tim. 3:16). Now I ask you, "When was the last time a book like "Gone with the Wind" or "Romeo and Juliet" was used for training in righteousness? Hmm! Exactly, no book has been and will never be printed that is more Holy and Sacred as the Bible.

Therefore, as you live the Easter joy in your life, as you walk by faith and not by sight with the Holy Spirit, trust in the Lord with all your might, your soul and your heart, for the Holy Spirit is there to open the door for your understanding.

St. Paul said, "the Spirit too comes to the aid of our weakness..." (Rom. 8:26). Wow! In my weakness: when I don't understand God's word or direction in my life, the Holy Spirit will come to my aid. God is Good, for God did not leave us as an orphan, "I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you" (Jn. 14:18).
