We have discovered the benefits of Zoom and have begun working together in ways not possible without virtual presence.

We find it easier to visit Ultreyas when they are as close as our computers, phones, or tablets. The Ultreya leaders have started meeting together to help craft the Fourth Day in collaboration with our Fourth Day committee leaders. Together we are thinking about how to balance virtual and inperson Ultreyas and events to better serve our community.

Group Reunion and Ultreya are the heart and soul of the Cursillo Method, and if we find new and better ways to support these functions, we will not only find it easier to grow as mature Christians, but our Cursillo community will thrive.



But what about weekends? This new normal is not without uncertainties. We hope and pray that the pandemic is over, but Autumn usually brings the return of the viruses, including the corona viruses.

With that in mind, we are now looking toward the Autumn of 2022 for the next Women's Weekend and the following Spring for the Men's Weekend, BUT, and this is particularly important, there cannot be а weekend without candidates. Essence of the Cursillo Movement

I recently came across this quote from Pope Francis' Fratelli Tutti. I often find things like this in reading the popes, but this one seems to me to capture the essence of the Cursillo Movement so very clearly. It comes from #88 and is expanded through the next several numbered sections. I highlighted some lines that really grabbed my attention.

"I cannot know myself apart from a broader network of relationships, including those that have preceded me and shaped my entire life. My relationship with those whom I respect has to take account of the fact that they do not live only for me, nor do I live only for them.

Our relationships, if healthy and authentic, open us to others who expand and enrich us. Nowadays, our noblest social instincts can easily be thwarted by self-centered chats that give the impression of being deep relationships. On the contrary, authentic and mature love and true friendship can only take root in hearts open to growth through relationships with others.

As couples or friends, we find that our hearts expand as we step out of ourselves and embrace others. Closed groups and self-absorbed couples that define themselves in opposition to others tend to be expressions of selfishness and mere self-preservation."

Cursillo is so very deep! But at its very deepest core (at least the deepest that I can perceive) lies the fact, the absolute and unchangeable fact, that God loves us, and that we can come to experience and live this deep reality of His love in coming to experience the love others have for us and the love we have for them. Words are certainly inadequate to express these realities, but that's why we have Cursillo. We can live these realities together beyond any words. We live them in the WORD. BILL STANTON ON THE FIFTH DAY

"You know, I struggle with Evangelization." I worked on a Cursillo Team with a first-timer named Bill Stanton in the 1990s. When Bill said this, I responded, "That is the exact reason that God wanted you to give this talk." Though not in my parish, not in my Ultreya, not in my group reunion, I talked to Bill Stanton monthly since being introduced to him. I last spoke to him about one month before he died when he shared that he was ready for whatever comes and if the experimental treatments he was scheduled for at Johns Hopkins did not work, he would not be with us. Then he told me, "Relax and don't over do it, like you usually do."

Bill was that best friend you wanted to be in your group reunion and lived a simple and joyful life in his struggle with Evangelization. In a talk about transforming environments, Bill shared more about the struggle saying, "If you struggle like I do at the shelter, then do it with love and eventually you will learn how to love." Everything he shared with me was clear, simple, and always done in love. He was fond of his faith walk with Janice, and his long-time pastor, Fr Peter Daly.

His ideas about how to engage people of other races and locales was especially instructive to me and is a lesson frequently called upon today. Bill and I often discussed his experience of going to Pass Christian, MS as the parish adopted a Josephite parish that had been ravaged by Katrina. When he went into a white parish that did not suffer much damage, he suggested that they do what he and his community would do here. Why not invite them here and share our space, and work with them until the parish gets back on its feet.


From his lived experience of Cursillo here, he mistakenly anticipated that the Catholic Community in Pass Christian respond as his parish would. Bill pondered how to best serve people in need in the post-Katrina environment and every place that he saw need.

We served on teams together with Maury Mattingly. He was part of the St. John Vianney posse that supported me through deacon formation and early years after ordination. He and Janice, along with Maury and Nancy Mattingly, and George and Sandy Sullivan, were the strangers that Fr. Norvel talked about their presence at Mass in an African American setting before he was introduced to the Cursillo Community here. Bill would routinely send me books to read, always looking to help me grow in the faith. The posse feared for my life in 2008 when I did not appear for the institution as lector, missing the turn for Mattawoman Beantown Road. The posse was relieved that I arrived before the Mass ended. I was 20 minutes away when I spoke to Bill to let him know I was in-route then I missed the turn and did not regain my bearings for an hour. As was his custom he forgave me, noted that if Jennifer was with me (she was out of town), I would have made We then developed a tradition to have a conversation whenever I approached Mattawoman Beantown Road.

Bill was a man who lived in the light of the Resurrection. In his struggle with Evangelization, even in the darkest moments, Bill never failed to find the light of Christ where he was. His physical presence will be missed especially by Janice, their children, grandchildren, and the parish community at St. John Vianney. His mantra will be remembered, "If you struggle, then do it with love and eventually you will learn how to love."

MARY TILGHMAN SHEARARD FIFTH DAY

We buried my sister, Mary Shearard on April 14, 2021. Mary was the sixth Tilghman family member to transition to her 5th day since Easter 2020. Mary was the picture perfect Cursillista. She was truly "the quiet one" in amongst the 13 children of Cyprian and Cecilia Tilghman. I think back over life shared with my sister Mary and note that she was the most soft-spoken of my siblings. She spoke to me of one disappointment in her life – she bet that I was a girl at birth only to discover in my first month home from the hospital that I was a boy with long hair.

This was another quiet moment in her life, not a lost bet but a moment of awakening. Mary was born on December 12, 1945. Mary was the oldest of the little people, the first among the last half of the 13 (Mary, Paulette, Joan, Angela, Jerome, and Timothy). My mother had the visitation on her mind at Mary's birth, so she was baptized "Mary Elizabeth," and so called by our mother. She pondered things quietly in her heart before acting. She had an eternal capacity to love that embraced her husband, George, children, grands, and great grandchildren from three different groups of children.

Surrounded by many who sought her counsel, there is not one among us who recalls Mary raising her voice in a situation other than providing a strong, onkey tenor voice in the Gospel choir.

People thought she was her baby sister, Angela's twin and knew her as the mother of the twins, Marguerite and Marlisa, and the steady voice in the chorus. When she was not singing in the gospel choir at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, she could be found at St. Francis of Assisi, Landover Hills where she volunteered as an interpreter and an active voice in the deaf Catholic community.

As one who worked with the deaf, she encountered two of our family Cursillo companions on the journey. When asked about her church life, she would share that her baby brother was a deacon. This is where she encountered Charlene Howard and Stefanie Miles, who shared her enthusiasm for communicating in American sign language and delighted to encounter her spirit in sign language classes. Others encountered her on women's ministry retreats. Wherever you encountered my sister Mary, you encountered the soft, steady loving voice of the Holy Spirit, the voice she brought into space where she dwelled.

Like the Blessed Mother for whom she was named, she was full of grace, which she shared with all. Her physical presence will be missed. Her spirit, which is that of the Holy Spirit, remains with us along with the memory of how she touched many lives. Ultreva!

Corpus Christi 2021

In December 2020, I was inspired by Deacon Timothy Tilghman's article in the Fourth Day News, "ADW Cursillo – This Time is our Time to Model our Method." Deacon Tilghman spoke of two pandemics:

"...there is the havoc put upon us by COVID-19 and the eruption of protests around the world upon the death of George Floyd. It appears that what some have called the United States' original sin, has infected other nations as well."

Deacon Tilghman cited Pope Francis' major writings of Evangelli Gaudium, Laudato Si', and Fratelli Tutti and shared:

"... Pope Francis has invited us to worship the sacred ground of the other, to build new human structures to save the environment, and to bring justice into our environments which is a manifestation of God's love for all."

During Lent this year, I decided to read Fratelli Tutti, as I had read our Pope's other two major writings. On Palm Sunday, my family and I were blessed to hear Mass at St Thomas More Cathedral in Arlington. As the Mass began, the Lord set on my heart our call to spread the Gospel and how I was personally called to respond. I shared some of my thoughts with Deacon Tim Tilghman and Ginny Novack, both of whom gave me feedback and spiritual direction.

The "harvest is plenty," but I see there are three areas where our Cursillo movement could move forward as a community, and I am most thankful for Tim and Ginny's spiritual direction and insights. First, let us continue to strengthen our movement. The virtual revival of the Ultreyas and the School of Leaders have been a great start! I was moved to see people who have been unable to meet with us for years to join virtually, and equally moving was the joy of other Cursillistas as they welcomed them back.



There are many more people that we can help to reconnect. Let us encourage our brothers and sisters to join us online and to upcoming in-person events. The work in evangelism and nurturing of our community is essential.

Secondly, while there will be no Cursillo weekend this year, we could invite prospective candidates to Learning Ultreyas. The current Ultreyas in the virtual format may be a bit overwhelming for a newcomer, but perhaps we could have special open Ultreyas to give a taste of Cursillo to newcomers.

Finally, is our call to more general evangelism, which takes many forms, including helping to foster social justice or restart ministries in our Church that have been shut down or have withered. During the pandemic, evangelism continued as catechism classes became virtual, and in-person courses and seminars such as Alpha and Marriage in Christ were adapted to be held online. As in fostering our own community, the need to meet virtually allowed us to be witnesses to the Gospel in new ways and suggested a way forward that we did not see just 15 months ago. In conclusion, I echo Deacon Tim, who wrote,

"... what Pope Francis calls for in his exhortations is what we have in our Movement already, small groups that represent the diversity of our neighborhoods, gathering to share a common faith and creating the possibility that there will be more saints in heaven."

Paraphrasing, St. Paul in 1 Corinthians, we are all parts of the one Body of Christ. As we begin to move out of the first pandemic let our many and varied gifts provide healing from the wounds of the second pandemic as we grow the Body of Christ. Ultreya!

Cursillo School of Leaders – Celebration Our New Normal

You are invited to Increase Your Friendship Capacity This Summer!

In July, the Cursillo School of Leaders (CSOL) will start to read the latest encyclical of Pope Francis, Fratelli Tutti (Brothers and Sisters All): On Fraternity and Social Friendship.

This document, released in October 2020, is the third encyclical from Pope Francis. Its themes will resonate with Cursillistas - love, peace, friendship, and making the world a more just and kind place. Pope Francis presents this encyclical as an invitation to discipleship built on love that fosters social friendship and universal fraternity.

Inspired by Saint Francis of Assisi, Pope Francis suggests that this call to build solidarity and work for justice must be rooted in our interconnectedness, which recognizes that "God has created all human beings equal in rights, duties and dignity, and has called them to live together as brothers and sisters" (no. 5).

CSOL meets the third Wednesday of the month at 7:00 pm on Zoom.

On Wednesday, July 21, we will discuss the introduction of Fratelli Tutti (paragraphs 1 to 8). We will also have an incredibly special speaker, Donna Valenti, who is English Region 2 Coordinator for National Cursillo. She will give a 30-minute presentation on The Founder and History of Cursillo. On August 18, we will discuss Chapter One, and on September 15, Chapter Two.
