HOW TO GIVE A TALK — THREE THINGS OUR HOLY FATHER WOULD SAY TO HELP YOU PREPARE

This is another answer to the central question of Cursillo: "How does my action help to build God's community?" I am still



working on the lesson Marty shared with me in 1994; he was the coordinator and I had the "ACTION" talk.

The lesson continued in CURSILLO LEADER WORKSHOP I, a package deal which included many of the leaders from the Region and especially Marty and Ginny Novak. I thought I graduated until I started joining Ginny on Talk Day. Giving a Talk is part of our couples' group reunion – another 10 years focused on the central question. Marty and Ginny, Nancy and Mike Vawter join Jennifer and me; sometimes the Dugues are with us.

We are always in the conversation about how to give a talk. "Twenty minutes," said the Angel. "Stick to the outline," is the talk day retort. This means capture the essence of the outline, not every word in the talk outline. There is a guy named Francis who lives in Rome. What are the three things he would say to help you prepare?

"All of us are called to offer others an explicit witness to the saving love of the Lord, who despite our imperfections offers us his closeness, his word, and his strength, and gives meaning to our lives" (Evangelii Gaudium #121).

When we talk about the living word, Jesus, there are three things that matter: What=> Jesus in the Word Made Flesh; So What=> Jesus impacts the world today; Now What=> He is impacting my world and he will impact yours if you will receive him fully.

"To speak from the heart means that our hearts must not just be on fire, but also enlightened by the fullness of revelation and by the path traveled by God's word in the heart of the Church and our faithful people through history" (EG #144).

In the talk, we are not asked to share the flowery or fluffy. "AUTHENTIC" is the key word in the talk, and authentic piety begins with the authentic witness.

We should emulate the Temptations who sang, "I'm bringing you a love that's true, so get ready!" in their 1960's hit GET READY. The enlightened heart is at the core of one who studies and lives the Gospel.

"An attractive image makes the message seem familiar, close to home, practical, and related to everyday life. A successful image can make people savor the message, awaken a desire and move the will toward the Gospel" (EG #157).

If we are consistent in what we present it at home, at the parish and on the weekend, the receiver does not see a good person or a nice parish; the receiver sees the living Christ, the one who Saul persecuted before his conversion and the one whose spirit permeates our Ultreya and Group Reunion.

Each one who presents a talk on the weekend has his or her 20 minutes to highlight some aspect of the light; Christ is the light. What does the attractive image look like? When I asked Bill Stanton what he remembered about his weekend, he replied, "I saw Tim and Scott." If he were one to use the day's vernacular, he would have said they were "BFF's" (best friends forever). I think it is safe to say that Bill and everyone who is seeking the truth are looking to see this. What did Bill see? The love of Christ!

Worried about what to say when your time to talk comes up? Three things - too many details for you to remember? To prepare for your talk, look at Holy Father Francis and remember these words of the Master Teacher:

"When they hand you over, do not worry about how you are to speak or what you are to say; for what you are to say will be given to you at that time; for it is not you who speak, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you" (Matthew 10: 19 – 20).

Talk to Christ daily. He will guide you!

WHAT TO REMEMBER ABOUT PALANCA

As we sit down to update our wonderful Community about the goodness of the Lord, we are pleased to report that the 214th Men's Weekend has eleven (11) men signed up but we need more!!! It would be great to get 5 more men applications for the 214th.

But at the same time it would be great to have on file applications for the upcoming women's 215th and 216th and for the 217th men's weekend. So consider it Palanca to make a friend, be a friend and bring that friend to Christ.

Palanca is a Spanish word that means "lever."

Just as a lever enables a person to move something which is beyond normal strength, Palanca, as used in Cursillo, empowers the accomplishment of things which would not be possible without the Grace of God. Today, perhaps more than ever, it is necessary to remind ourselves that without God we are nothing, bereft of value, and incapable of doing anything of spiritual value.

With that in mind, we must keep the concept of Palanca in balance. In other words, whatever service we perform on a Cursillo weekend will have little or no value if done in and of ourselves. Palanca, which is one of the most characteristic marks of the Cursillo method, is effective only when the prayers, sacrifices and works of mercy are done in conjunction with the presence of the Holy Spirit; allowing God to use us to serve his people.

If the effectiveness of all the human efforts in the Cursillo movement is to be assured, Palanca must be genuine and offered by communities and individuals living in union with Christ.

The purpose of Palanca is to serve as God's arms and hands in the lives of the candidates on the weekend by extending the grace which has so freely been extended to us. Bear in mind that letters in and of themselves are not Palanca! Letters are merely one vehicle in which we convey the actual Palanca being done at that time. In other words, the effort, thoughts and prayers that go into the letters are actually the Palanca, not the letters themselves.

Palanca can fall into several categories; not all of which result in notes or letters. I employ you to please keep the sponsoring of new brothers and sisters so we can have a surplus of applications on hand early enough so ample planning can be done both by the sponsors and the team.

By all means let's keep the sponsoring of new evangelizers for Christ going. I know you can do it.

Fifth Day Corner

Joseph Novak, the Fifth Day

August 25, 2014 was the most grace-filled moments in my life of preaching God's word. I was the homilist at Marty Novak's Mass of Christian Burial. For most at St. Nicholas that day, it was the first time ever hearing of Marty as "Martin Joseph Novak." I thought the first funeral I would preach would be my father's; I did not know that it would be my father in the Cursillo Movement until Marty died.

Marty came in one of the best packages of blessings I have ever received. Like most in the church on August 25th, I met Marty and Ginny. It was a package deal, the first and most important church, the Domestic Church, a precious gift to St. Nicholas from its beginnings on Contee Road in early 1970's and to the Cursillo Movement in the Archdiocese of Washington.

I knew I was special because of the way Marty loved me, starting when he was Coordinator for the first weekend that I worked in 1994 and continuing until he began his Fifth Day. Marty and Ginny answered every Cursillo question I had, filling in gaps when I attended my first Cursillo Leaders' Workshop shortly after working the weekend in 1994. He was faithful to our monthly couples' group reunion for more than 10 years. This was the Domestic Church that taught me lessons about living with and loving in-laws in their twilight years and challenged Jen and me to discern a call to serve as Lay Directors of our local Movement. The personal contact which is the heart of "make a friend, be a friend and bring a friend to Christ," was Marty's mantra for his relationship with Jennifer and me. For us, Marty embodied the meaning of the Old Testament scripture proclaimed at his funeral Mass, "But I will call this to mind as my reason to have hope; the steadfast love of the Lord never ceases" (Lam 3: 21 - 22). From the time we met, Marty loved with all he had and made me aware of God's love for me.

His life was not just for me, for Ginny and their family. Since the founding of the parish in the early 1970's, Marty and Ginny were present to parishioners and people in Montpelier, just as they were to Jennifer and me. There were parish priests and Jesuits, seven permanent deacons, in addition to Deacons lannaconi and Hannagan from his parish with whom he walked.

There is a vibrant Cursillo community at St. Nicholas and nearly every member of that community is connected to someone for whom Marty Novak was a sponsor to join the Movement.

We heard this part of Marty's mantra in the day's Gospel: "I will not reject anyone who comes to me, because I came down from heaven not to do my own will but the will of one who sent me, that I should not lose nothing of what he gave me" (John 6: 38 39). Marty lived as a principal assistant to the Sower in the Father's garden who was open to all and produced much fruit. In his death life continues as he was also the wheat seed that died to produce fruit. As long as we live as he lives God's love will flourish. Marty's message to us in his home going is very simple: I love you! Ultreya! Let us continue to love as Marty loved, and make a special effort to extend that love to Ginny and their family they grieve the husband and father to his children and many in our Cursillo Movement.

- We again moved back into the Josephite House and are now starting next year our second contract with them that will go through 2016.

Welcome to Cursillo School of Leaders 2014-2015

We are truly fortunate in having a Pope who ignites the imagination of people throughout the world, and not only Catholics. From his choice to live simply and among the people to his public call to political and religious leaders to stop the slaughter of innocents in Syria, he is making his mark on the world and, with any luck, on our lives.

When Pope Francis wrote an exhortation to the Church on the "Joy of the Gospel", the message seemed to drive to the heart of the charism of Cursillo. It's hard to ignore his words as they come sailing out of the pages as a challenge to rethink our Baptismal commitment.

Reading the Scriptures also makes it clear that the Gospel is not merely about our personal relationship with God. Nor should our living response to God be seen simply as an accumulation of small personal gestures to individuals in need, a kind of "charity a la carte", or a series of acts aimed solely at easing our conscience. The Gospel is about the kingdom of God (cf Lk 4:43), it is about loving God who reigns in our world. To the extent that he reigns within us, the life of society will be a setting for universal fraternity, justice, peace and dignity.

(Evangelii Gaudium, Chapter 4, 180)

These words excite and challenge. They speak to our charism "to be the Good News" and they point to evangelization, the object of our piety, study and action. Thus, we are using this papal exhortation as the background for our study this year in School of Leaders.

We are starting off slowly, focusing on the preface and first chapter during the remainder of calendar 2014. With the New Year, we will look at the final section of Chapter 1 and go on to Chapters 3 and 4. We recognize that it is not possible for everyone to get to our sessions and in an effort to reach more of our community, we will be posting a study plan with the chapter on which we will focus, some scriptural reference and the discussion questions we will use during our sessions.

Please read and think along with us, use the questions for discussions in your own gatherings, and come join us at School of Leaders whenever you can. We meet at St. Joseph's on Route 202 just outside the beltway from 7:00pm until 8:45pm, usually on the third Wednesday of each month. This year's sessions are: Sept. 17, Oct. 15, Nov. 19, Jan.21, Feb. 25, Apr. 15, May 20, and June 17.
