


Cursillo Annual Fundraiser

THE METHOD BEYOND OUR MOVEMENT

There were two recent events in my life that prompted me to write this note to our Cursillo community. The first was my attendance at a Sodality meeting when the newly elected executive team presented its action agenda for the next two years. The second was a witness at the closing for the 219th Cursillo, *Open the Eyes to My Heart Lord.* At these events, my eyes were opened by the witness of Cursillistas, one who has mileage on her fourth day, and the other had moments into her fourth day.

At the Sodality meeting, the prefect started with a new prayer to open the meeting which included these words: "Help each one accept the gift of your unselfish love that will embolden us to prefer the more humble tasks and rejoice in the good done by others." I said to myself: "This is a Cursillo meeting."

The prefect continues to set the stage inviting Sodalists to voice concerns about how to be better evangelists to her rather than sharing a sad story with another Sodalist.

And the prefect continued with a focus on the mission of the Church, evangelization, which included more prayer, spiritual reflection, and then outreach to old Sodalists and invitations to young adults of the parish to share in the mission. There was a millennial on the executive team. When I asked her what mission work she planned to do, she spoke of the desire to serve the community as prefect in the future. When asked about the present, she shared with me the desire to get married in the Church, invite the man in her life to share in her faith, and join her in communal conversations about sacramental marriage. My silent response to the Sodality leadership was "thank you," and "thank you, Jesus."

Then there was the **Open the Eyes to My** Heart, Lord closing. When the selfproclaimed millennial stood up to witness about how she saw Christ, she spoke of "the way she saw her parents and their friends pray during her formative years, clear evidence of the method in the ministries at her parish, and her mother's consistency in witnessing to the faith." And, she closed her witness with "we should invite more millennials to live the life that she was living." The witness talked of sharing the life that her parents and their friends shared with her. Mother and daughter cried as a statement of joy and authenticity to the witness.

The title, *The Method Beyond Our Movement*, is a misnomer. The method of our movement is the way the Christian witness lives the life of grace and faith.



When our oldest daughter started her fourth day, she said that she recognized the three-day experience because it was the way that her mother and grandmother taught her to live. She then added, the chance to preview the Sunday sermon because homilies read at the dining room table added to mom and grandma's daily witness.

Why am I saying this today? Our Cursillo Method is the most powerful demonstration of the power of authentic witness in inviting people of all ages to share the communal life with Christ. Our Movement is "of many colors," Black, White, Latino, Vietnamese, Korean, Filipino, African and some other folk. It includes folk from Hollywood in the South to Damascus in the North, and everywhere in between. There is nothing else like it in our Archdiocese.

What am I asking of this Cursillo community? I invite you to do what Jesus did after John the Baptist when he shared with his followers the lifesaving message of our Cursillo Movement: "Behold the Lamb of God" (John 1:36). When John's followers approached Jesus, he responded: "Come, and you will see" (John 1:39). We have something to show the Archdiocese and all of DMV. We are the picture of the living Body of Christ in this community.



The last word comes from Holy Scripture: "Remember your leaders who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Do not be carried away by all kinds of strange teaching" (Hebrews 13:7-9). The prefect and the millennial in the Sodality and the self-proclaimed millennial witness at the closing brought this Scripture to life by their witness. Our God is bigger than our problems. Why not do as the protagonists in this story did? Come, see, and then witness to the power of the Body of Christ in our Movement to change the neighborhood, then change the world. Ultreya!


Cursillo Behind the Scenes

Did you ever wonder what it takes to put on a Cursillo weekend or the work that goes into it? It takes all the committees of the secretariat to put on a weekend. Here is a glimpse behind the scenes.

First the coordinators are picked by the 3 Day Committee based on the qualifications of the nominees, then the list of nominees are presented to the secretariat and a vote is taken as to who will best serve Cursillo. Not all nominees accept this leadership, I am happy to say that the fine coordinators for 2017 have said yes to the leadership and are serving Cursillo, they are: Burma Hill, Coordinator for the 221 Women's Weekend. May 18 – 21, Cheryl Kerwin, Coordinator for 222 Women's Weekend, October 12 - 15, and Michael Lillis, Coordinator for the Men's 223 Weekend, November 16 – 19. Each of the Coordinators will be assigned a liaison person from the 3-day Committee to make sure the weekend is well taken care of. The 3 Day Committee is responsible for all materials needed for the weekend get to the weekend on time.

The Communications Committee then informs the community of the dates of the upcoming weekends and the community is encouraged to invite candidates to make a weekend. The Ultreyas are urged to encourage their members to "Make a Friend and Bring a Friend to Christ".

All applications are sent to the Pre- Cursillo Committee with either a \$15 dollar deposit or the full amount (\$195), before they are sent they must be signed by both the Ultreya leader and spiritual director (priest or deacon).



Applications must be in by the deadline; for the May weekend, it is May 4, for the October weekend it is September 28 and for the November weekend it is November 2. After the deadline comes, letters are sent to both the candidates and sponsors to make sure they are ready for the weekend. The applications are then sent to the Communications Committee so the information can be entered in the computer and get the packets ready to give to candidates at the end of the weekend. They also put the Palanca list out so the community will know who is on the weekend and hopefully do Palanca for everyone on the weekend. A copy of the applications is also given to the coordinators by the time of their team party so they can learn about the candidates and make table selections. Applications for all the 2017 weekends are now being accepted. You do not have to wait until the week before the weekend to send in applications, in fact we would prefer that you do not wait, this will ensure your candidate a space on the weekend and give you more time to prepare them for the weekend.

The 4th Day Committee is responsible for anything that happens after the weekend including the closing. They are the ones who let the Ultreyas know what to bring for the closing and which Ultreya will be the helper Ultreya. The coordinators of the weekends work hard for 6 - 8 weeks before the weekend making sure their team is ready for the weekend and the committees work hard with all the coordinators to ensure each weekend will give praise to Jesus, the candidates are His guests and we are His hosts. Now you have a glimpse of what it takes to put on a weekend. I hope you will join us in working in God's vineyard! De Colores
