Your 3-Day Committee

We wanted to thank all of those who helped with the move from the Josephite House to the Washington Retreat House at 4000 Harewood Rd NE Washington, DC. It went very well.

There are 3 weekends scheduled for this year (2011) at the Washington Retreat House:

Women's 204th May 12-15th

The Secretariat also selected 3 weekends for next year (2012):

Womens's 207th February 2-5th
Women's 208th October 4-7th
Men's 209th November 15-18th

The coordinators for the 2012 weekends will be announced later.

As listed on the Cursillo website, the duties of the 3-Day committee follow:

- * Designate the leadership team for the Cursillo weekends.
- * Education Serving Committee in preparing the weekend team leadership for weekend planning and team formation.
- * Arrange where and when the weekends will be held.
- * Maintain and manage the inventory lists of supplies for the weekends.
- * Be on call during each weekend in case the team has emergency needs.
- * Disseminate information regarding the Weekends and the Cursillo movement.

The 3-Day Committee ideally should be comprised of folks from every Ultreya. Currently represented are Calvert County, NE/SE, Montgomery County, Laurel, and Bowie/Lanham. We would love to have representatives from the other Ultreyas, so please let us know if you would like to serve with us!!

So, how are coordinators chosen for the weekends? Here is the process:

To be eligible to be a weekend coordinator you must 1st and foremost be practicing the method (being active in group reunion and Ultreya). Then you must have worked at least 4 teams, giving at least 3 talks and one meditation or 4 talks. Hopefully the talks have been spread over the 3 days of the weekend. You must also have served on the core team (i.e., as assistant coordinator, shepherd/angel, or musician). Being active in the School of Leaders and other Cursillo events is also taken into account.

The persons that meet the criteria, are then listed by male and female candidates, in order of their longevity in the movement. Once finalized, the two lists of names are submitted to the Secretariat for approval. Once approved, the candidates are called in the order they appear on the list. The first one that says yes will be the coordinator.

This process is followed each time coordinators are chosen. And there is a new list developed each time.

We hope this information has been helpful. We also hope to have a regular spot in the 4th Day News to keep you updated in our role in the Movement.
