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UNWRAP THE GIFT OF CURSILLO AND LIVE THE "CHARISM OF CURSILLO" TO THE FULLEST

We must drink from the source. To return to the source is to drink from the wellspring from which water flows. To drink from the source is to be "reborn" with each sip of the original pure water.

The above introduction in the book, "The Cursillo Movement - Study of the Charism" from the writings of our founder, Eduardo Bonnin, sums up why we must learn about the Charism of our Cursillo Movement to live it. To understand our Charism, thereby live its fundamentals, our School of Leaders will study Bonnin's writings starting January 2012.

A Charism is "a <u>gift or grace</u> of the Holy Spirit to help us live out our Christian lives and serve in the building up of the Church." All movements of the Catholic Church have their own Charism. Our Charism is Spirit-empowerment through Christian community. Its message is, *God loves us*, and its means to convey the message is, *friendship*, living a life in grace. It is this Spirit-empowerment that was the vision of Eduardo Bonnin.

God gave this special gift to Eduardo Bonnin who viewed it as an answer to his prayers. Eduardo shared his vision and mission with close friends, a group reunion, and from that collaboration of both the human <u>and</u> the Divine grew our Cursillo Movement.

"The giver of the gift and the receiver of the gift have become one in spirit and this has transformed lives and those lives have transformed environments."

This explains why our Cursillo Weekends are so powerful. Why we remain with the Movement long after our Weekends. And why we live the method -- Group Reunion and Ultreya to encounter the Holy Spirit through Christian community in our 4th Day.

Our founders knew that it takes more than a gathering of Cursillistas to make a Christian community; it takes the dynamic process of people coming together, sharing their faith, and growing understandings as one empowered by the Spirit.

Come, share and grow at the School of Leaders. Together let us unwrap the gift that began as a dream for a humble little man from an obscure island in the Mediterranean and which, through his love and dedication to God and others, spread around the globe.

Together, let us capture his dream and live it as intended. It is by examining our roots that we better understand, and better live, the gift of Cursillo given to us by the Holy Spirit many years ago. As *Philip said in John 1:46 "Come and see for yourself".*



WHO ARE THEY?

HOW DO THEY WORK?

AS A GROUP, MEMBERS OF THE SECRETARIAT SHALL GUIDE AND COORDINATE ALL PHASES OF THE CURSILLO MOVEMENT IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF WASHINGTON DC WITHIN THE PASTORAL PLAN OF THE BISHOP, AND CURSILLO MOVEMENT

WHAT ARE THE POSITIONS?

• LAY DIRECTORS

Through leadership, the Lay Directors unify the movement on all levels and indicate the path to be followed in essential matters of practical detail. They are responsible for the spirit of unity throughout the movement, organization and methodology of Cursillo, and nurturing the leaders of the Movement, especially the Secretariat.

• SPIRITUAL ADVISORS

The diocesan Spiritual Advisor(s) make sure that Cursillo stays in line with Church doctrine and tradition. They are proposed by the incoming lay director(s) and approved by the archbishop or his representative.

• <u>CURSILLO SCHOOL OF LEADERS</u> (CSOL)

The Cursillo School Of Leaders should be the core of the Cursillo Movement. It is the key source to find and support individuals who take on Cursillo as their primary apostolate, a community of Christians who serve the rest of the Cursillo community. It provides the opportunity for Cursillistas to form and share the vision of god's plan for the movement. It is the community of Cursillistas who grow together in a deeper understanding and living out the Cursillo method.

• **PRECURSILLO COMMITTEE**

This committee works with Cursillistas in identifying environments to be Christianized and assists them in selecting individuals who could be instrumental in the process of Christianization. Individuals within those environments are prepared for the three-day Cursillo and an ultimate commitment to the Fourth Day.

• THE 3-DAY COMMITTEE:

The 3-day committee, along with the entire Secretariat, is responsible to the Cursillo Community and to Our Lord Jesus Christ to provide the environment in which His Presence can be shared and celebrated. This commonly is known as presenting a Cursillo Weekend.

• FOURTH DAY COMMITTEE

This committee encourages the spiritual formation of Cursillistas and to advance the Cursillo goal of Christianizing environment. This method includes group reunion, Ultreya, spiritual direction and community strengthening events.

<u>COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE</u>

This committee is responsible for informing Cursillistas of planned activities, literature available, Cursillo newsletter (Fourth Day News), as well as Palanca needs for the Washington Movement.

• TREASURER

In consultation with the Financial Officer, the Treasurer ensures that the Secretariat is kept abreast of the Movement's financial situation. Advises the Secretariat, and Financial Officer, of any forthcoming financial problems or needed changes.

• FINANCIAL OFFICER

In consultation with the Treasurer, makes sure sufficient funds are available in the Treasury so the Washington Cursillo Movement can remain financially viable.

• **SECRETARY**

The secretary transcribes the minutes of the Secretariat meetings and keeps records of this information for the files of the movement.

The Secretariat is here to serve you...get to know them, and consider volunteering your time and talents for one of the various committees... and as always, pray for them as they pray for you....
