## <u>Change of Venue for 2011</u> <u>Cursillo Weekends</u>

#### <u>NE/SE ULTREYA HOSTS A</u> <u>SPECTACULAR QUARTERLY</u>

NE/SE Ultreya hosted the most recent Quarterly and to quote many of the guests as they left the event, "we had such a good time this evening!" The event was held on Saturday January 23, 2010 at the resident parish of the NE/SE Ultreya, St. Anthony of Padua Catholic Church and Margot Hall in Northeast Washington, DC.

The evening began with the 5:00 p.m. Vigil Mass in the Church. Cursillista Father Joe McCloskey celebrated the Mass dedicated to the Washington Archdiocese Cursillo Movement. Most of the musicians at the service as well as one of the Lectors were Cursillistas representing their home Ultreya.

Following the Mass, the evening's festivities moved to Margot Hall. The celebration continued and the mood of the event became "let the party begin." As a potluck affair and with the theme "Taste of Cursillo," many of the dishes available were submissions from our recently published cookbook "Bubblin' with the Holy Spirit" (a few left and currently available for sale). The attendance was greater than expected and additional tables and chairs had to be set up in order to accommodate the standing-room-only crowd of partygoers.

Father Charles Green, another dedicated Cursillista led everyone in grace before the meal. Then, dinner was served buffet style. In spite of the larger crowd, the food never ran out. It may not have been the loaves and fishes, but it certainly fed the hungry throngs.

Once everyone had the opportunity to eat and socialize with long time friends and fellow Cursillistas, it was time for the main event – the entertainment! Everyone came expecting to be entertained and they were not disappointed. The parade of entertainers went on for no less than two hours. The list of performers ranged from bell ringers, to the "golden girls" dancing and lipsynching to "I'm a Single Lady," to vocalists singing everything from Spanish hymns to pop tunes. We might not have been on Broadway, but there were several dramatic presentations.

We were also entertained by the telling of Biblical tales, as only Cursillistas can tell them – with a serious sense of humor, or the desire to be a beatnik working in some Christian coffeehouse. The evening's "showstopper" was the rousing rap inspired number performed by the Washington Secretariat under the lead rapper, MC Stefan (Abresch). This has to be the only rap group to ever feature a priest who towered over all of the other holy "gangstas."

Further, we are happy to confirm that all Ultreyas within the Archdiocese of Washington were represented at the event. Although the sign-in sheet listed a count of 72 persons, given the number of seats available, and the fact that additional tables were set up, the "unofficial" number of attendees had to be over 100.

On behalf of the NE/SE Ultreya, a special prize was presented to the Ultreya with the greatest attendance; in this case the Saint Teresa of Avila (STA) Ultreya. Presented to their Ultreya Leader for having a listed 13 persons in attendance, was a "Spiritual Bouquet" of 100 Masses to be offered by the host NE/SE Ultreya for STA's Ultreya and its members. Members of NE/SE Ultreya pledged to make this offering in gratitude and thanksgiving for supporting the quarterly. #### A Best Friend's Remembrance

# *Fr. Levester Jones* 1953 – 2010

Shortly after I began my 4<sup>th</sup> Day in 1993, I remember being introduced to the Cursillo community at St. Teresa of Avila. There was a young man who was not just excited about the faith, but also excited about my presence at his church. He was inviting, welcoming and real, and best of all, always present to me.

Christ knew what he was doing when he paired Levester and me as table leaders in 1996 for the spring 1997 Men's Cursillo; both of us were discerning and our group reunion produced two priests (Levester and Steven Bell) and, the "deacon to be" from "the hill."

It was at a group reunion at McDonald's on Route 214 that we (Steven, Kerry Dugue and I) heard about Levester's call to the priesthood. While at St. Mary's Seminary, Roland Park, Levester invited me in – introducing me to the community prayers of the Church whenever we met at the seminary or at my dining room table. And Levester always picked out the best gifts – getting me my first Book of Christian Prayer, so I could pray with him even when we could not be physically present to each other. He got one for Jennifer, too, so that I would always have a prayer partner that was physically present.

We talked in-depth about how to live the faith, through his formation and mine – monthly lunches and phone conversations 2-3 times per week. *People let me tell you 'bout my best friend, he's the one and only person who'll love you 'til the end* is a song from a 1960's TV show that best describes the way my friend loved me.

So, what made Levester special? He had a limitless capacity to love and be present – recall Father Pat's homily at his memorial Mass about

the one priest who extended the invitation to commune with him. He did these gatherings with his ordination class and African American priests, as well. After doing all this, he did the same thing for each and every parishioner he encountered, at every parish he ever served.

When we talked in the hospital it was always about getting back to the parish. Our last conversation was about my ordination – he wanted to make sure I had everything so that he could vest me on ordination day. He loved everyone in the same way he loved me.

We will miss his physical presence, but know by Levester's life that God keeps his promises and St. Paul was right when he said, *"For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, no principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 8:38)."* 

His health did not stop him from loving me, or anyone else who will read this. Levester reminded me of our best friend, *the one and only person who'll love you 'til the end* – Christ.

In Levester's memory, let's love as Christ loved. *Ultreya! DeColores!*

Christopher and Abigail Baczynski; Dave, Billy, Christy, and Tony Handle; Kristin, Nicole, and Will Giery; and Colin and Jason McGee. We lost Christopher to SIDS-Sudden Infant Death Syndrome and now we are gaining Laura, who is Dave's fiancée. What gifts you were to us, and still are to me!

If ever I had a reason to be jealous about Bob loving something more than me, it was his work. He was an expert at restoring old fireplaces and solving brick laying problems. He and Bobby have an excellent reputation of doing good work – they really are artists. You can see some of their work on the poster, Bob the Bricklayer. Bob truly loved his work and continued at it until Thanksgiving of this year. If he had recovered, he would have gone back to work. Loving your work – what a gift that is in this day and age!

Thirty-six years ago we both made a Cursillo weekend and were immediately blessed by meeting so many wonderful Christians. They are still our friends today and have been gifts to us.

We joined the Covenant Community of Jesus the Good Shepherd when we moved here to Dunkirk and received so many more gifts. Our newest group that we are part of is the Balaam's Asses. Look it up in Scripture, Old Testament, Book of Numbers. And through it all, there are some long-time friends that we have been blessed with who don't belong to any group, but were near and dear to us. You have all gifted us by your presence here today. Bob and I shared a very gifted life.

Bob and I had talked a couple of times of how we wanted to celebrate our 50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary. Well, I talked about it and he listened. He knew it was important to me to celebrate that event. He also knew that he was sick. After he died Christmas morning and all the children had arrived at the hospital, we prayed and then headed home to celebrate Bob and Christmas. The first one to get a present was me. It was a gold ring for our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary from Bob.

All good gifts surround us. They come from heaven above. So thank the Lord, thank the Lord for all his love. I really want to thank you, Lord.

## It's So Easy to Panic

Panic: Run for the Hills – Incoming Snowstorm Likely to Be Historic; Crippling Accumulations Over 1 to 2 Feet May Be Common

These words greeted all of us recently as that great snowstorm approached. You saw them on weather websites, you heard them, or at least variations of them, in references on TV, and you saw them in the newspapers.

Our news services have to sell us on their services to survive, and so, they exaggerate as one means of selling us. When they use words like "crippling," "historic," "gigantic," "make final preparations," and the like, they are trying to incite people to listen longer, buy their products in the print media, or simply panic. No one can argue that underlying these words was a real need to prepare for a storm, but the words used in some ways incited folks to panic.

Going to the grocery store the night before the storm was instructive about how much panic had set in. Store shelves were nearly bare from the onslaught of folks who had descended upon the store during the day. The staff at the store was worn out and the shoppers mostly wore worried looks on their faces as they weaved in and out of aisles and around other shoppers. A lot of them were trying to move very quickly, apparently feeling a little worried that they were not going to get all the things they needed if they didn't have a fast pace and quick hands to grab things off the shelves.

Aren't we sometimes like this in our spiritual lives? We wear worried looks and act worried in our prayer, our work, and with those around us. Each of us can probably identify a time when we might describe our mind sets as being one of "Panic: Run for the Hills."

When such a mood sets in, we need to realize that, to some degree, we may be being tested by the Lord, who is calling us to a deeper level of trust in Him. If we truly trust in the Lord, there is no need for panic – for all things are under His control. Worries and doubts plague everyone from time to time, but aren't the states of minds of worrying and doubting a little easier to fend off when we are grouping as we should be, using the Cursillo method? As Cursillistas, we have been blessed with the advantage of having folks who are like minded, seeking the things of heaven, and sharing their walks with others in small groups. As Christians, we shouldn't worry, for, after all, everything is truly in God's hands.

So what was your state of mind as you heard the panic words used by our news media? Were you worried or were you calm? If you can't decide, your small group will help you out.

#### PRAYER FOR PROPER USE OF MY TALENTS

Let me always be aware that people are more important than things and we should never use people in a negative way in order to acquire things. Lord let me be supportive of people who want to make positive changes in their lives.

Lord give me the grace to direct those entrusted to me or who ask my help as they seek You. Let me be Your instrument Lord.

Let me always use the proper words, take the proper actions and always give the proper example. For these blessings, I pray. Amen.

Leader - a person who rules or guides or inspires others, that is one definition according to word net.

While I will be talking about guiding others and hopefully inspiring others, I will be speaking of a different type of leader. I will be speaking of a leader who has been called to lead – not as the head of a group of people, not as one who gives orders or makes commands, nor governs others. No, the leader I will be speaking of is one whom God has called to be His willing and faithful servant; he is one who God has chosen to step forward and be a disciple and to be a voice to others through his actions. This leader is no different then any of you here tonight. He was just someone who one day heard God call out and he answered.

The person I speak of is none other then myself. As a leader, I have not risen up through the ranks, nor have I been appointed, voted in or even set out to be a leader. No, my being a leader is not something I set out to do nor is it something I aspired to do. No, my being a leader happened without my even knowing it was happening. It happened because God intended it to happen.

#### You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit--fruit that will last. Then the Father will give you whatever you ask in my name. JN 15:16

If I go back to the beginning, it was that Sunday morning just over two years ago when Deacon Bobby White asked me if he could sponsor me for the 194<sup>th</sup> Men's Weekend. With no idea what a Cursillo was or what I would be expected to do, or even when I would be expected to do it, I responded 'yes'. There was no thought or hesitation on my part because I just answered as God wanted me to answer; it was His call that I heard and I said 'yes'.

I made the weekend and all throughout the first year of attending Ultreya, I was determined to have a small group reunion. But I knew so few Cursillistas and as I didn't drive, I set about trying to find someone in my own church. Then one day I thought if I could not find a group reunion, I would create one of my own. At that time I sponsored the first of the two persons I have gone on to sponsor. A third person was scheduled to have done her weekend last month but was unable to do so at the last moment. She is now scheduled to attend the next Women's Weekend.

I have always taken my position of sponsor seriously and have walked with Christina and Darwin throughout their year as babe chicks; and will continue to do so as long as they will allow me to do so.

While seeking out Cursillistas at my church, I did discover there were several who had made their

weekends years earlier and at one time might have been active. But for whatever reason, they had lost touch with the community and (while still Cursillistas) had become inactive in Ultreya, group reunion and so many of the other Cursillo activities in the area. After speaking with many of them, I found that they were still active in their commitments to prayer, meditation and study. They still keep that relationship with Christ, but had lost touch with the larger community of Cursillistas.

Well God must have wanted them to find their way back to the community of their brothers and sisters, and through me He decided to bring them back together. I just followed His direction in deciding that if these people are not able to come out to join the community then we will bring the community here to them. I asked our pastor, who is also a Cursillista, if we could organize a monthly reunion at the church on Sunday morning, between the two scheduled Masses. He agreed to allow it. After speaking with many of those persons whom I had approached, I realized that they were ready to become active within the community again; but having the community at church made it much more convenient for them and this would be the perfect solution. Well I can now announce our first meeting is expected to be Sunday, April 11th and if those who have expressed an interest come, there could be no less than six Cursillistas - not counting the three of us who group on Sunday morning. There is even interest from those who have seen the announcement in the bulletin and have expressed interest in learning about Cursillo.

Just this past Sunday Deacon Bobby White spoke in his homily of hearing God's call and his words were, "Will you answer if He calls you?" Well when he asked that question, I had my closest moment, for I could say 'yes'. I heard Him call and I said 'yes'. So in closing I will say, if all of that makes me a leader, then I suppose I am one; but I was just doing as God has asked me to do and keeping to my commitment as a Cursillistas.

Here I am, Lord. Is it I, Lord? I have heard you calling in the night. I will go, Lord, if you lead me. I will hold your people in my heart.
