The Washington Cursillo Movement is currently gathering information concerning working a concession stand at Fed-Ex Field for the 2010-2011 season. ## **Calling All Cursillistas!**

Come and see! You are always welcome to join us at our monthly meetings. Since we are all LEADERS in the Movement, Jesus is counting on YOU!

Our sessions are a wonderful opportunity to group with your sisters and brothers from the various Ultreyas. You will definitely be enlightened by a doctrinal presentation based on our study book, "Whom Shall I Send? Discerning the Will of God, by

Father Frank S. Salmani. You will also have the opportunity to hear witness and share insights on this year's technique theme of Leadership.

"Whom Shall I Send?" is an official National Ultreya publication. As Father Salmani states in his Prologue: "Any community of people will need a retreat for themselves at one time or another. This book addresses two basic questions:

(1) What does God want from me right now?
(2) Is God calling me to be a Cursillo leader or some other work? Every Christian needs to know what God's will is for him or her. This book is a process to help discern the Lord's call. The book does not attempt to tell anyone where they should be or what they should be doing. That is up to the individual. What the book does tell us is what God expects of anyone who commits themselves to him in any way. The specific nature of the call is up to each individual to discern."

Cursillo School of Leaders meetings are held on the third Wednesday of each month at St. Joseph Catholic Church, 2020 St. Joseph Drive, Largo, MD, from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., unless otherwise announced.

One such time is for our Advent Day of Reflection. This year it is scheduled for Sunday, December 6. 2009, at 2 p.m. at the Pastoral center in Hyattsville, MD. The Day of Reflection will take the place of December's School of Leaders meeting.

We will return to St. Joseph's for our regular 3<sup>rd</sup>-Wednesday meeting on January 20, 2010.

# Be Accountable: Watch the Company You Keep

"And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to goodworks:" --Hebrews 10:24

Believers are called to think about how to help other believers live right. This not only applies to attending church, but also to being involved in a small group. Believers gather so that they can help one another and be accountable to one another.

I lift weights from time to time, and I've found that it is best to do it when I have a partner. A good partner will not let me skip certain things or slack off, but will force me to go ahead and take an extra set. When I get stuck, a good partner helps me finish what I am doing. In short, a good partner holds me accountable.

James 5:16 says, "Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed." The word "faults" mean "side slips, transgressions, or sins." Notice that it does not say to confess your faults to your pastor. Your pastor is not the only one you are accountable to. There should be other believers in your life that you are accountable to.

If you're married then your accountability partner should be your spouse. If you are not married, there should be someone of the same gender who can come to you and ask, "How are you doing on this issue?" It should be someone that you will tell the truth to. You don't need to tell everyone your business, but you do need to be accountable to someone who can help you and provoke you to love and good works.

Unbelievers cannot be your hanging buddies. If they are, it will not be long before you are living in sin as they are. You also cannot keep company with those struggling with a sinful area, whether they are an unbeliever or a believer. You might say, "I

can't cut that person off. He's family. She's an old college buddy." But you cannot minister to that person while you are slipping into the very same sin in which he or she is entrapped.

I used to have friends who gossiped about other people. I would be talking with them, and it was not long before they started talking about someone, and I would join in. I soon realized I could not spend my time sinning like that. I had to cut them off for their own good and mine.

You can't say that you can never be around unbelievers, because if that were the case, you would have to leave the planet. Unbelievers are not living right, but you cannot reach them with that attitude. You must operate in love. But keep in mind that you must maintain boundaries. God sets these boundaries because He wants His best for your life, and does not want you to go through things that you do not have to go through.

So, be accountable and watch the company you keep!

We then went to full throttle in a timeline filled with some heavy duty lifting. A team composed of Cursillistas - Flora Solano (and her computer-savvy daughter Barb), Jerri and Less Evans, Diane Miller and John Geron, combined information listed in the (soon to be updated) 2006 Washington Cursillo directory, Forestville membership lists, and the memory banks of those who were babe chicks many moons ago. We met in various locations - the rectory basement, McDonald's restaurant, and Shoppers Food Warehouse. Pruning down the lists, we finally agreed on a workable list. Now what to do with it?

The Holy Spirit provided us with an "AHA" moment, and we conducted a telephone blitz, contacting everyone we could possibly reach. But we were dealt a real ace in the hole at the annual Cursillo Relax and Reflect retreat. When announcements were made at the end of the retreat, our Lay Leader Jackie gave an open invitation to everyone of the 60+ retreatants to attend the Awareness Day Mass. This was a blessing!

The Awareness Sunday: When the cursillistas began arriving on that bright Sunday morning, we were thrilled, for we had spent some interesting moments during the preceding 75 days of planning asking ourselves, "suppose only a handful show up?" The above picture shows that about 60

people attended, including three who were not in the photograph. Afterward, two men not only made the decision to make a weekend, but their sponsors immediately stepped up. Praise God!

Lessons Learned: So what were the lessons and insights? 1) Some attendees affirmed that the phone calls they received "brought them back" after several years of absence; 2) Our work team felt uplifted by God's presence at every session; and 3) It works! We want to encourage every Ultreya to do this, for in doing so you will give praise, honor and glory to our great God! Guaranteed!


