I encourage all of you to be an angel to those who first need the roots, so that they can bloom where they are planted. It's very important to take in a fellow Christian, and inspire those who just need a little push. Remember, God does the rest. The Sponsorship Challenge

As Cursillistas, we can all join heartily in the recitation of our call of action to "Be a friend, make a friend and bring a friend to Jesus." However, based on the decline of candidates for our two most recent weekends, many of us have not put those words into action. So now, we must ask ourselves, "if not, why not?"

The challenges to sponsorship were discussed at the School of Leaders session on October 19, 2011. While opinions varied, and the discussion was lively, the general consensus came down to candidate selection and sponsorship commitment. It sounds simple enough, but the underlying challenge lies in the time it takes to do both, well. Our church congregations are full of potential babe chicks. Virtually all of us are involved in various church ministries, which is a good starting point. So, who out of our respective ministries would we invite to make a Cursillo weekend? The natural response would be to ask the persons we know best; the ones we feel "friendly" toward. Again, if we are not really "friends" with anyone on the ministry, we may need to take the "time" to cultivate a friendship. The "unknown" factor was also mentioned.

In other words, we just don't "know" if a person would go on a weekend, and then be inclined to stay involved after the weekend. Others felt they were not "worthy" to be a sponsor. Thus, the potential for a candidate/sponsor relationship is never developed.

The delicate question of finances was also considered a stumbling block. For some, it is awkward to "invite" a person to make a weekend, and then inform them they must "pay" to attend. Some folks have been sponsors in the past, but did not follow through on the commitment to walk with their candidate for a year. Therefore, they hesitate to take on the role of sponsor, again. We also explored the question if there was any real difference in sponsoring men versus women. A guick survey of our church pews, committees, and past Cursillo weekends, indicates that women are more numerous than men, thus there are more to choose from. However, there was no real consensus as to perceived differences in sponsorship. In our Movement, women have successfully sponsored men, and vice versa. Generally speaking, the group felt that men wanted to know more about the details of the weekend, and did not buy into the "surprise" element as readily as women. Timing was another factor; weekends held during football season or March Madness may yield a lower turnout of men.

Our discussion concluded with a challenge to start cultivating souls now, so we will have a harvest to deliver for the upcoming weekends. How we respond, is up to us.

CONFESSIONS OF A SERIAL SPONSOR

Just a few days ago at the CSOL, we broke into small groups and discussed the challenges of sponsoring candidates for a weekend. I listened to those in the group who had sponsored one person if that in the many years they had been a Cursillista.

They each expressed many challenges and they were valid challenges. "Who to ask", 'time commitments", "how do you discuss the money", "what if they aren't interested or say yes" "do I feel worthy of this".

Then when I decided to voice my answer I had to honestly say," I don't find any challenges in sponsoring someone." For those who may not know in the three years I have been eligible to be a sponsor someone, I have sponsored five people, co-sponsored one, will sponsor a person in the upcoming Men's Weekend in just a few weeks and have begun working with someone I expect to sponsor in the next Women's Weekend in February. I also jokingly call myself a grandfather sponsor because the first person I sponsored has co-sponsored one person in addition to the other person she has sponsored, she too hopes to have another person doing her weekend in February after having had to postpone her scheduled weekend twice this year.

I say none of this in a bragging or boastful way , but to demonstrate that being a sponsor is not the fearful or intimidating unknown challenge so many believe it to be.

Let me share with you some of the methods I use and which have proven successful with me. First I decided since I could not find a small group to join, I would create my own. I found a friend (Christina) at church and introduced her to the concept of small group. I began to take her to Ultreya. Then we decided we needed someone else to join us. A group of three was better than a group of two, so we brought Darwin into the fold. By the time the next women's and men's weekend came along they were both ready to be a part of it.

After organizing a Group Reunion at my church, which was open to both those who had done a weekend as well as those who had not done a weekend, without aggressively recruiting I directed my attentions to those who had not done a weekend. I made certain they became familiar with the concept of "make a friend etc." More importantly I introduced them to the idea of being a part of a family, and that as a family we look out for each other. I introduced them to the idea of group prayer and group witness. As they began to embrace each, other they realized there was something spiritually lifting and enlightening in what they were experiencing and they wanted to be more a part of it all. As one would come back from a weekend the others wanted to do likewise.

I also felt that they should be informed and enlightened about Cursillo, what I had was no secret. If they had questions, then I felt I should have an answer. I informed them that the weekend was just an introduction to something that was far more important than whatever they would be doing on their usual weekend. I exposed them to Ultreya and invited them to other Cursillo or Ultreya activities. When they saw the open expressions of love and fellowship demonstrated by the community, they were eager to be a part of it.

There was even the one occasion where the matter of cost had to be discussed and as much as I would have liked to help with the cost I explained that the sponsor's role was not necessarily that of a financial sponsor. At this point she was so enthusiastic about doing the weekend she managed to save the cost out of her fixed income. There have also been those occasions when the Ultreya as well as the Group Reunion established a scholarship fund, to help those in need of the payment. No I never lost one candidate because of their inability to pay the cost of the weekend.

Finally I just allowed others to see that light of Cursillo that shines within me, a light that they wanted to have shining within them. It is truly a blessing to be able to have others come to me and ask me to sponsor them now, because of what they now see in me. I have jokingly kidded at the fact that I am like a virus now infecting all that come near me with the spirit of Cursillo, but truth is all I have done is "be a friend, make a friend and bring a friend to Christ." Now I can't think of anything I would rather do for a friend. My sponsorship is not over at the end of that first year. By the end of that year I have found that our friendship has grown stronger based on something far superior to any forces here on earth. Our friendship now is based on our common love and faith of the Lord and with those threads that bind it, I don't ever expect it to fray, unravel or be broken.

I hope these words now encourage you to think about the true joys of sponsorship and help you overcome what you may feel are your "challenges to sponsorship"
